#### RABBI SCOTT KRAMER'S COLUMN

Shalom,

This bulletin will arrive as Passover is almost at its conclusion. We hope that this will be the last Pesach we have to do in isolation due to the pandemic. Next year, may we all be in Jerusalem! May we all be free to observe Passover together with friends and family we miss being with and speaking to without a screen.

Two special events will happen on April 11 this year, one in the morning and one in the afternoon - Yom Haatzmaut and Meitav Menachem

At 9:30 a.m. April 11 during the Kol Ami Religious School, we have a very special event celebrating Israel Independence Day. Thanks to the Alabama and Executive Director Tzlil McDonald, we have a new Shlichah. The Israeli emissary is working with several communities in Alabama teaching both young and old about Israel. Meitavichem, a charismatic Israeli

Menachem, a charismatic Israeli young woman, did a Hamantaschen baking session with the Kol Ami families. She also gave a session to adults on how Israel elects its leaders.

On April 11, Meitav is going to teach through the use of a Seder and food about this special day in the Jewish calendar.

The Alabama State Days of Remembrance Yom HaShoah Holocaust commemoration will be held 2 p.m. April 11 virtually.

This year the Alabama Holocaust Commission (of which I am a member) in collaboration with the Birmingham Holocaust Education Center and the Jewish Council of Human Relations, part of the Birmingham Jewish Federation, is producing a prerecorded Yom HaShoah event that is packed with special guests. Lynn Raviv, daughter of Phyllis Weinstein who recently passed away, Zoe Weil of the Birmingham Holocaust Education Center - daughter of our very own Tina McManama and David Zaslawsky - Joyce Shevin of the Jewish Community Relations Council and I are preparing this program for Yom HaShoah and the Anne Frank Tree Rededication.

The press release is in this bulletin. We are very excited to have an address from the new Israeli Ambassador to the United States, Gilad Erdan. We will get the link to you so you can participate in this annual event for the first time online.

# MAKING YOU SAFER WITH A SYNAGOGUE AIR FILTRATION SYSTEM

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently issued school guidelines for in-person classes that included upgrading ventilation systems to provide a safe environment for students, teachers and staff. That's exactly what we've done at Agudath Israel Etz Ahayem for our joint Sunday school classes with Temple Beth Or. Although classes are not currently

in-person, we are ready when we have the go ahead to resume students and teachers coming to the synagogue. The iWave air purifiers installed in mid-February kill viruses and bacteria. And Covid-19.

Those iWave air purifiers have been installed on both sides of the Sunday school building. Additional air purifiers have been installed for The Jewish Federation of Central Alabama offices.

"The simple reason we did this is we want them (teachers and students) to feel as safe as they possibly can to come into our synagogue and not have to worry about viruses and bacteria," said Dickie Blondheim, vice president of fundraising for AIEA.

Of course, we want a safe environment for all our congregants and that's why iWave air purifiers have been installed for the Aronov Chapel (the smaller chapel), library, all offices and bathrooms.

After a thorough review of the effectiveness of the air purifiers, three will be added in the fall for the large sanctuary, kitchen, foyer and social hall.

And the estimated \$6,500 for the air purifiers and installation was donated.

"We know this is not 100 percent perfect, but we are doing whatever we can do to protect (congregants and guests)," Blondheim said

It is close to 100 percent protection, according to Dennis Tillery, owner of Montgomery-based Tillery Heating & Air Conditioning, which installed the iWave air purifiers at AIEA. He said that a test showed the product had a 99.4 percent reduction rate against Covid-19. "I'd say that's pretty strong," Tillery said.

Four of the installed air purifiers were the iWave R models that treat up to six tons of air and one C model that treats up to 12 tons of air. The R model has been installed in 200,000-plus applications, according to the company's website.

"It has the ability to reduce allergens and eliminates what we call in the industry 'dirty-sock syndrome' because of that stale smell," he said. "It can actually control cooking odors as well." No more worrying about a special recipe that creates or may create an overpowering odor throughout the building.

The air purifiers even reduce smoke, static electricity and other airborne particles, according to the iWave website.

The air purifier uses bi-polar ionization, "which splits the molecules down to gases," Tillery said. The air flow from the ventilation system flows through the iWave air purifier, which cleans the air.

It's another tool to make us all safer – social distancing, facemasks, vaccinations and ventilation systems that kill viruses, bacteria and mold – and shorten the time when we can come back and attend services and events in person.

In order to add this system to the kitchen, large sanctuary, foyer and social hall, we will need an additional \$5,000.





## Alabama Annual Holocaust Remembrance Event to **Include Anne Frank Tree Rededication and Educational Materials for Students**

BIRMINGHAM – The Holocaust Days of Remembrance, an annual observance of Yom HaShoah by the state of Alabama, and the rededication of the Anne Frank Tree in Kelly Ingram Park, Birmingham will be streamed online on Sunday, April 11 at 2 p.m. CST.

The Holocaust Days of Remembrance (Yom HaShoah) solemnly observes the memory of the 6 million Jews killed in the Holocaust and honors our Alabama survivors and their families.

Anne Frank, a young Jewish victim of the Holocaust who is famous for keeping a diary of her experiences, often looked out upon a large horse chestnut tree in the garden as she and her family hid from Nazi capture. For her, the tree symbolized freedom as well as nature, which she longed to enjoy once again. In this spirit, we will hold the Anne Frank Tree Rededication at Kelly Ingram Park. The new tree, an American beech, will replace the horse chestnut tree planted 11 years ago.

The featured speaker will be Pastor Chris Edmonds. Edmonds recently received the Righteous Among the Nations award on behalf of his father, World War II hero Master Sgt. Roddie Edmonds who saved Jewish American soldiers in a prison of war camp in Germany, captured during the Battle of the Bulge. The award is from Israel and Yad Vashem, the world's Holocaust Remembrance Center.

Alabama Gov. Kay Ivey will read a proclamation and the Alabama Legislature has planned a presentation. Birmingham Mayor Randall Woodfin is scheduled to open the program and will be followed by Pastor Agnes Lover of St. Paul AME Church in Montgomery, who will deliver the invocation.

The program includes music by Violinist Niv Ashkenazi as part of Violins of Hope, an artistic project comprised of instruments that were owned by Jewish musicians before and during the Holocaust. There will also be a candlelighting ceremony with Holocaust survivors and their families; a memorial prayer chanted by Birmingham-based Temple Emanu-El Cantor Robert Wittner; and a closing prayer by Pastor Ed Nettles of Freewill Baptist Church in Montgomery.

Educational materials will be available for schools to prepare students to watch the program.

The program is organized by the Alabama Holocaust Commission, Birmingham Holocaust Education Center and The Jewish Community Relations Council of The Birmingham Jewish Federation.
