THE RABBI'S COLUMN

We are in the midst of Passover. The cleaning and gathering of Passover foods consumes us.

Every year I ask the question, "Why? What is the significance of all this work and expense?"

I am looking for the meaning behind the sweat and tears. Searching every year keeps the observance fresh and meaningful.

This year, I am finding meaning in the special Shabbatot that precede the holiday.

The first is Shabbat Shekalim. Long ago Shabbat Shekalim was a reminder to pay the half shekel for Temple maintenance and those pesky sacrifices.

The second special Shabbat is the Shabbat before Purim – Shabbat Zachor. It recalls Amalek who was the ancestor of the "man that shall not be named."

The fourth is Shabbat HaChodesh and precedes Nisan, the first biblical month of the year. It is the month in which Passover occurs.

The Shabbat I found meaning in this year is the third – Shabbat Parah. This special Shabbat reminds us of the ancient custom of using ashes of the red heifer to ritually purify those who came in contact with a dead person. Only the pure could eat from the Passover sacrifice at the Temple.

We are reminded to begin the purification process in preparation of observing the Passover holiday.

Today, red-heifer ashes do not exist. We do not have the Temple. In some sense we all remain in a state of impurity. But we still try to remove that impurity by cleaning our homes.

Impurity is also represented in the food forbidden on Passover. Chometz or hametz is any food that is made from wheat, barley, rye, oats or spelt and has come into contact with water allowed to ferment and rise.

Anything made from these grains except Passover matzah is chometz. This includes flour, cake, cookies, pasta, breads and items that have chometz as an ingredient.

As long as chometz is not consumed or found in our homes we exist in a state of absolute purity.

After spending time cleaning our homes, changing out dishes and purchasing over-priced Passover goods don't you feel more pure spending the week living in a very clean house?

Ridding our homes of chometz

is only part of the reason for all this hard work. Reaching a place of purity is a major undertaking and when we work hard at it there should be a feeling of accomplishment.

I hate the cleaning. But when I taste the matzah at the Seder table with family and friends I know why I worked so hard.

We have to do the work in order to have the experience. Here is wishing that all of you experience a very healthy and kosher Pesach. Chag Kasher Pesach!

This is a Power of Attorney form authorizing Rabbi Scott Kramer to act as your agent to sell all the hametz that remains in your possession before the Holiday of Passover begins on Monday night, April 22, 2024. It is customary to make a donation to Agudath Israel Y Etz Ahayem for this service.

NOTE: If possible, all hametz – food not acceptable during Pesach (Passover), or materials containing such unacceptable food – should be destroyed or given away before the holiday begins. Should this be impossible, the hametz may be stored in such a way that we are sure not to use it during the holiday and its actual ownership is transferred to a non-Jew until the holiday ends. Please complete the form below and return no later than Tuesday April 18, 2024.

I, the undersigned, full empower and permit Rabbi Scott Kramer to act in my behalf to sell all hametz possessed by me – knowingly or unknowingly – as defined by Torah and rabbinic law, and to lease all places wherein hametz owned may be found. This transaction will be in effect for the duration of Pesach, which this year begins with sundown of April 22, 2024, and runs through sundown of April 30, 2024.
